Dear Friends, This month I would like to share with you, our friends in the church, just what we did on our Elders' Day which was held at the Convent in October.

These days are very good for us because they give us as a group the opportunity to get together and look at how God is part of our life beyond the practicalities of running a church. At this time of vacancy we are in a position to be challenged and take the church forward.

We invited Bob Goody from the Scripture Union to come and speak to us about new ways to deliver worship to everyone. Bob has been inspiring and encouraging young people to come to God, he looks for ways to make worship interesting, and other ways to do 'do church'. Well we may not have been young but were equally as keen to learn.

It was a good day and gave us the motivation to keep the Church going, renewing us to carry on, as sometimes we do not always recognise how well we are doing, and just how many talents we do have to offer. Whatever we are doing right we need to keep going, building on what we have done. We cannot though become complacent and think we can settle for where we are, it is about looking ahead and thinking of new ways to share the gospel.

Bob offered us an analogy of stepping stones, thinking of ways to get to the next one without losing people on the way. Each stepping stone to faith needs to be followed by encouragement and support in order to reach the next one and know and love God.

So renewed and inspired we discussed the opportunities available to us over the next months to put this into action. I came up with an idea to pick up the amount of people on the streets on Halloween night, and offer them an alternative way to celebrate it. Myself, Steve, Margaret and Kathy invited people to light a candle for someone they loved and missed, telling them about All Saints Day and what it meant.

We were not sure it would be success but were pleasantly surprised to see that all those we approached were quite happy to be part of the celebration and were genuinely touched we had made the effort. People from all ages joined in and 50 candles were lit remembering a loved one. We handed out a leaflet about what the church was >>>

>>>> doing with the hope that we may see them again ready for the next stepping stone.

At this moment we are in a time of grace where we have the chance to look at the future of the church, any changes we may like to introduce. It is not just the Elders who are in a position to do this, everyone who cares about the church can contribute to this.

So let's be brave and reach out into the unknown, we are all God's disciples, we do not need a title to allow the call of God to lead us forward. What is next? I do not know but I am sure something will be.
