# How Traidcraft are - Keeping Doors Open for Trade

Last year I had the pleasure of visiting an organisation in Peru called Manos Amigas, who work with local producers to help provide fair trade market access for their products. Traidcraft have been working with Manos Amigas since 2014 and I wanted to share a number of coincidences that have helped to develop and strengthen this young partnership.

Firstly, one of our long-term partners in Peru,Minka, decided to close its organisation in 2013. It meant that several producer groups that Traidcraft were working with, such as The Alpaca Knitting Associations, would lose their access to the UK market.

We already knew about the excellent work of Manos Amigas, and so we decided to contact them. They were enthusiastic about working with some of Minka's producers and to continue providing fair trade market access for their products.

Then in 2015 Manos Amigas lost a key UK partner, when Creative closed their fair trade commercial activities. It meant that the relationship between Manos Amigas and Traidcraft became even more relevant.

Manos Amigas is a very small team and always full of positive energy. At the heart of the organisation is a wonderful lady called Yannina Meza, who is incredible at multitasking and her many roles include that of designer, exporter, marketing, fair trade and business mentor. On top of this she is also a very active member of her church.

Yannina and myself visited several of the Manos Amigas producer groups such as Juan Carlos Diaz ceramics workshop which is located in Chorrillos, a poor neighbourhood in the southern outskirts of Lima. Many of the people in the area are from the Peruvian rural areas and many moved there during the civil conflicts and drug eradication programmes in the 80s and 90s. Electricity and drinking water are two

services that have just arrived in the area where Juan Carlos lives and works. Juan Carlos very proudly explained how Manos Amigas works with them and in particular highlighted the level of trust that exists among them.

For example, Manos Amigas provide advance payments of 50% with the orders as well as making the final payment as soon as the products are delivered to the warehouse. Furthermore, he explains that training is provided in product development, quality, costings and health and safety.

I have recently been thinking about producer groups such as Juan Carlos. Peru has been badly affected by the El Nino climate phenomenon, which has brought rain, floods and mudslides in several areas, destroying houses, bridges, roads; and affecting the distribution of water, electricity, food and cooking gas, especially in the poorest neighbourhood such as Juan Carlos. Manos Amigas as well as other fair trade organisations in Peru have been providing extra support to the producer groups they work with.

As Juan Carlos said himself "the best support is from the orders we receive and make with our hands, allowing ourselves to earn a fair income". This is the best help that Traidcraft and its supporters in the UK could provide to Manos Amigas and its producers groups in the current difficult situation.
