<u>Prayer</u>- When we open God's book may we remember that we're looking for Jesus, the rescue He offers, and how to live as his children. Amen.

The Bible was written by people, people who told stories and passed them on and sat down and wrote them. It comes from real people and real places at a particular time. It is a record of God interacting with people- a collection of stories that teach us what it looks like when God is at work through actual people. The stories we are looking at could be our stories- who hasn't felt 'shipwrecked' and overwhelmed? Sometimes we might have been obedient, going against the grain like Noah, trusting God's word, or we may have wanted to run away and sulk like Jonah.

This week's story is about some men who were going about their daily business, they were fishermen,



but not this sort of fishermen, men who fished for a living as a job



# READING: Bible Story-Matthew 4 v. 18-22

<sup>18</sup> As Jesus walked along the shore of Lake Galilee, he saw two brothers who were fishermen, Simon (called Peter) and his brother Andrew, catching fish in the lake with a net. <sup>19</sup> Jesus said to them, "Come with me, and I will teach you to catch people." <sup>20</sup> At once they left their nets and went with him.

<sup>21</sup> He went on and saw two other brothers, James and John, the sons of Zebedee. They were in their boat with their father Zebedee, getting their nets ready. Jesus called them, <sup>22</sup> and at once they left the boat and their father

<u>Retelling-</u> If you are with someone at the moment have a go at retelling the story to one another, or if alone, jot down what you can remember from the story

<u>Remembering the story</u>: Have you ever used a doodle sheet - you can make notes, diagrams and draw pictures to remember a story and remind you of the key points.

Have you used 'wonder questions' before? "I wonder if.....? or I wonder what...?" These can help us to consider new aspects of the new story and explore new ideas as we consider what God is saying to us. Give it a go now...

Questions are good- we don't have the 'answers' and the idea is just to think aloud, to wonder, to ponder the story. We will all see something different. Here are 2 questions:

1) Is this the beginning of a story, the end of a story or both?

2) When you retold the story, did Jesus's words sound like a command/challenge or invitation?

<u>Reflection or join in with song – you can use the song to reflect on the story or join in the singing</u>

Song- 'Lord you have come to the seashore'.

#### Response

We have our own stories of times when life changed for us. Remember Jesus said in John 15v16- "you did not choose me, I chose you". Our stories are precious to God.

You are invited to take a strip of paper about the size of a 30cm ruler

You will see below I have written 0 at left hand end and my age now at right hand.



Now divide into quarters. You will have a strip that represents your life- nos. =ages. Write in a couple of things that shaped your life- moving house, marriage, college- things you can say I was that age when that happened mark/symbol/picture



Now if not already, write in 2 things part of your spiritual story.

## Spend a few minutes reflecting on this and creating your timeline
