# Don't Miss the Boat HURC Summer Worship – 30<sup>th</sup> August 2020

Good morning and welcome to worship. Today is the sixth and final instalment in our summer worship series "Don't Miss the Boat". Today's Boat Story comes from John chapter 21, and focuses on Peter and Jesus.

Here's how The Street Bible puts it:

"The third time Jesus shows up is when the team are back up in Galilee. Seven of the old team are fishing on the lake. Jesus is on the shore, but too far away to make out. He shouts "Caught anything?" They shout back "Nothing!" He tells them to put the net out on the starboard side. They do, and the net's so full they can't drag it back in. Pete realizes, 'It's the boss!' and swims to the beach. The rest moor the boat and join them. Jesus has made a fire; they grill some of their catch for breakfast. When they're stuffed full Jesus confronts Pete on the denial thing and the rooster. He's gentle, but asks how much Pete loves him. The answer: totally. Pete's given the job of building up the squad."

Our first song was written in August 1961 by John Peterson. It describes the personal testimony of how an elderly man gave his life to Jesus, but in many ways it also represents the personal testimony of the disciple Peter.

**Question 1:** Over the last 6 months, many people have lost a great deal, and just like the disciples haven't known what to do. Loss of living as we have known it, loss of community, employment, family and meeting together in church fellowship. **During this time of loss for many, in what ways has Jesus come to you?** 

**Question 2:** When the disciples went back to their old familiar way of life without Jesus, they clearly got nowhere fast. Life was dark, difficult and empty. When they listened and responded to the call of Jesus from the shore, they were greatly blessed with God's provision for them.

How do you listen for Jesus and how does he bless you?

**Question 3:** Even though Peter had failed Jesus, Jesus still loved, forgave and gave him a fresh start.

In what ways do you experience Jesus now and how do you share that love with others?
