Welcome to this short version of the church newsletter. The church building may be closed but 'church' is the people and we are still here!



The question on everyone's lips When will the church building be open again?!

The honest answer is – we do not know.

There will not be one member of our fellowship who would not like to see the church doors wide open and the church full - but with no treatment for the Covid19 virus available and a, still relatively, high infection rate this is neither safe or desirable.

You will all be aware that churches had permission to open for Private Prayer from the 13th June provided strict Covid19 guidelines were followed.

This was discussed at the Elders meeting which agreed that, for the time being, the church would remain closed until we could guarantee the safety of all who may visit and those who would supervise.

We have carried out a risk assessment of the building and will need to put in place restricted seating, a 'one-way' system and sufficient sanitising points and cleaning provision before we can safely open, along with several other requirements yet to be announced.

Therefore, when, eventually, we do have permission to hold collective worship **it will not be as we knew it**. Which brings us to some very important decisions that will have to be made – and for these the Elders would like to ask for your help.

The Service on the 14th June looked at The Purpose of the Church under 3 headings: -

1. To worship God 2. Grow a God like community 3. To share the Good News of Jesus and the Elders would like you to think about the following questions

he Purpose of the Church

1. To worship God

- a) How have you managed to worship during 'lock-down'?
- b) What makes you want to come to Hornsea URC at 10.30 on a Sunday morning?
- c) What 3 things do you think are needed in an act of worship to God.

2. Grow a God like community

- a) What does a God like community look like to you?
- b) Have you seen any evidence of this during 'lock-down'?
- c) How do you think we can continue to build this in the future?

3. To share the Good News of Jesus

- a) Have you been able to share the Good News of Jesus in 'lock-down'?
- b) Has anyone been able to share it with you?
- c) In what ways should we share it in the future?

Over the next couple of weeks your Elder will give you a call and have a chat about these questions. There are no wrong or right answers and you may not cover all the questions but the conversations will help us greatly, in planning for the 'New Normal' as we return to worship together. Thank you.


It has been a long time!
