

Becoming Church Lent Series:

The Book of Acts gives us a fascinating insight into the life, fellowship, and worship of the early church, as it developed post-Pentecost. Based on Acts 2 vs 42 - 47 the verses that form the backbone of this study are very familiar, often referred to as 'Holy Habits', and are always worth spending a little time with, as they speak to us about our own 'habits' and how they might change, or adapt, to the greater benefit of God's call on us to share our faith and make disciples 'of every nation'.

Our BECOMING CHURCH Lent series will take us through 5 services, followed by Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday as follows:

6th March Becoming Church: Learning and Growing Together
13th March Becoming Church: Breaking Bread Together and Prayer

20th March Becoming Church: God's power at work

10th April Palm Sunday17th April Easter Sunday

Acts 2 vs 42 - 47

"They spent their time in learning from the apostles, taking part in the fellowship, and sharing in the fellowship meals and the prayers.

43 Many miracles and wonders were being done through the apostles, and everyone was filled with awe. 44 All the believers continued together in close fellowship and shared their belongings with one another. 45 They would sell their property and possessions, and distribute the money among all, according to what each one needed. 46 Day after day they met as a group in the Temple, and they had their meals together in their homes, eating with glad and humble hearts, 47 praising God, and enjoying the good will of all the people. And every day the Lord added to their group those who were being saved."

World Day of Prayer 2022



Annie's Eco Corner

Hello Everyone,

February certainly goes quickly; it's surprising how just those 2 or 3 fewer days make the end of the month come round sooner.

As many of you will know I now have a new Canine Partner puppy called 'Dawn', in memory of Sharlah's mum (no pressure I'm assured!), but if she has any of Dawn's spirit, she will be a feisty pup!

We are, amongst other things, working on toilet training, which has meant I'm thinking about poo- a lot! I've begun to consider how we dispose of doggy poo when we take our dogs out, and as there are approximately 500 million plastic poo bags used worldwide every year, that's a lot of poo and poo bags to think about. They are an essential piece of kit for any responsible dog owner, but how much do we actually think about what happens after it goes in the bin?

Of course, the poo itself will rot down and decompose but what about the plastic bag? Lots of poo bags are labelled as 'decomposable' which sounds great, but in reality, all that means is the bag will break down into ever smaller pieces, but never fully disappear. What we need to do is use bags which are labelled as 'compostable' and fulfil European standard EN 13432. These are made from cornstarch, so will completely decompose and leave no trace at all. Whilst they are a little bit more expensive, they are completely eco-friendly and much better for the planet.

I hope some of you managed to try out the 'recipe' for the eco friendly surface cleaner made from citrus peel and white vinegar? If not, or you prefer something ready-made, the Leafy Seadragon's multi-surface cleaner has been tried and recommended for everyday use. You can refill your own bottle, or if you don't have a suitable bottle, you can buy one to fill and then keep refilling it in the shop.


Their laundry liquid has also been tried and tested and found to be very good. Its suitable for those who have sensitive skin and often struggle with the 'Big Brand' detergents, it can work out cheaper and the cleaning power is just as comparable.

Now the weather is slowly improving (strong winds notwithstanding), we can start to spend more time outside in the beautiful world we have been given to enjoy and care for.

- Fairly traded products guarantee a fair price and living wage for everyone in the supply chain (eliminating exploitation).
- All fairly traded products have to meet environmental and sustainable targets – many being organic (minimising harm to the planet).
- Fairtrade gives people on the margins a voice (through cooperatives and mutual support).

How is it in our hands? All we have to do is **choose to buy fairly traded products** – there are LOTS of products available on the stall at church and in the supermarkets with the Coop leading the way.

How can we change what is happening to the climate? Fairly traded products are gentler on the environment than intense, industrial production using fewer resources and chemical interventions. So, by **choosing to buy fairly traded products** we have a much kinder footprint on our planet.

'SWOP SHOP' will be open every Sunday morning in March for you to try a new brand of fairly traded tea, coffee, chocolate, washing up liquid etc.
