In addition, we are joining with our friends at the Methodist for a 'Tea and Praise' service on Sunday 8th May at 5pm in our church. All are welcome.


Practical Christianity Explored

Buy a brick for Leprosy



The Leprosy Mission want to build a new Research Centre at Anandaban Hospital.

High on a hill at Anandaban in Nepal a pioneering work is taking place. In a crumbling lab on a mountain top, the team are making scientific breakthroughs that will have a global impact.

But the lab is now at risk of closing. It's too small, not fit for purpose and was severely damaged in the terrible earthquakes of 2015. It won't pass the upcoming Nepali Government inspection. Without this lab, the chance to end leprosy in our lifetime will be lost forever.

The research team desperately needs to develop an early diagnostic test for leprosy. This is vital to diagnose leprosy on the spot, so we can cure people as quickly as possible. They are already testing pioneering new treatments to prevent people suffering physical disabilities because of leprosy. To save more people from the devastating effects of leprosy, we must build a new world-class research centre at Anandaban, on the roof of the world.

Steven was telling us on Sunday of his upcoming 'significant' birthday and that he would be donating an appropriate amount to buy bricks for Anandaban.

There will be a box for donations at the front of church and we will build a wall to see how far our donations are going!

All monies donated for the rest of the year will go towards the building of the new research centre.

Hello Everyone,

Welcome to this month's green corner. I have two important things to make you aware of this month. Firstly-

The Big Plastic Count 16th-22nd May

The U.K. produces more plastic waste per person than almost any other country, only the United States is worse. The Big Plastic Count is the U.K.'s biggest ever investigation into household plastic waste. The evidence obtained from the survey will be used to push the government, supermarkets, and manufacturers to take much needed, urgent action to tackle the problem of the U.K.'s plastic waste.

The count will be held over the same week all over the U.K.- 16^{th} - 22^{nd} May and you can obtain all the information you need and sign up at-

When you sign up, you get a digital electronic pack e-mailed to you, or you can ask for a pack to be sent out by post (recycled paper and plastic free of course). You can also download the digital pack and print off your paper copy of the 'how to' guide and tally sheet.

Please join me, because we need as many households as possible to take part. Let's get to the truth about plastic waste and what actually happens when it goes to be recycled.

The second thing to tell you about is our-

Green Eco Fair Saturday 10th September

Put this date in your diary/on your calendar! We are inviting local businesses and initiatives who are trying to 'do their bit' to help address climate change to take part. They can be using local resources, using minimal packaging, addressing waste issues, using alternative sources of energy, anything that helps towards the issue of climate change.

Hopefully there will be presentations from different organisations and also a selection of local trade and business stalls at the fair. I have also contacted our **Green Apostle** at Synod, who will hopefully be able to attend. She will be able to update us on what the Synod is doing to support churches to fulfil their 'creation custodianship', and how our church can move forward in that role. There will be a lot more information to come about this event, so we will keep you updated over the coming months.

The Yorkshire Synod's BIG DAY'S OUT are back!

Open to ALL the church family, friends and relatives + anyone who meets in our church or hall.

We have been enjoying the BIG Day Out as a synod for a number of years now it is an opportunity to bring together church families from across the synod for a day of laughter, fun and worship.

Lightwater Valley has a wide range of rides and activities to suit all ages. This includes soft play areas, outdoor adventure parks, treetop trampolines, a carousel, crazy golf, swan boats and a relaxing train ride that travels through the entire park. There is also a forest area with woodland walks and nature trails.

If you find yourself needing a moment, or looking for someone to talk to, or fancying a warm drink then head to the Show Barn. A small team of people will be in the Show Barn throughout the whole day. There will be a time for worship together at some point during the day. This will be inclusive to all.

The synod will also be running a short program out of 2 marquees in the park for you to get involved in if you wish. JPIT will be talking to us about climate change and we will be celebrating 50 years of the United Reformed Church. And keep your eyes open for wandering nativity characters.... Food and drink are available at the park but there are also plenty of picnic areas so feel free to bring your own lunch.

The entry fee is much reduced to £15 per person 3+ and the Synod is subsidising the cost of our coach – making the cost about £5 a head, if we fill the coach.

September may seem a way off but an early commitment will mean that we can book a 53-seater coach (and apply for the subsidy) and start saving up - final payments can be taken up to the 3^{rd} September. Booking forms available in church or from Margaret Knapton
